Lighting a Candle

Perhaps the simplest of all devotions is the lighting of a candle. Catholic churches are characterised by their shrines to Our Lady and to the Saints, with candles burning before them. Candles take us back to our roots when Mass was celebrated after dark or in the catacombs, the underground Christian burial sites in Rome.



There is something very moving about small children, accompanied by their parents, stretching out to light a candle and being taught that the flickering flame represents them and their prayers.
