Prayer for the Child in the Womb

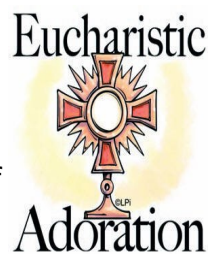

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

The Mass is the greatest prayer of the Church. God gave us the gift of His Son Jesus who at the Last Supper and on the Cross gave Himself up to God for our sake. Jesus rose from the dead on Easter Sunday and gave His Holy Spirit to the Church on Pentecost Sunday. Jesus gives us Himself at every Mass and remains present in the consecrated hosts of bread which are reserved in the Tabernacle or sacred place. When Jesus is present in the Church a red light is kept lighting in the sanctuary of the church near the altar.

Feast of Our Lady of Carmel (Brown Scapular)



According to the traditions of the Carmelite order, on July 16, 1251, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to St. Simon Stock, a Carmelite. During the vision, she revealed to him the **Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel**, popularly known as the "**Brown Scapular.**" A century and a quarter later, the Carmelite order began to celebrate on this date the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. The feast celebrates the devotion that the Blessed Virgin Mary has to those who are devoted to her, and who signal that devotion by wearing the Brown Scapular. According to tradition, those who wear the scapular faithfully and remain devoted to the Blessed Virgin until death will be granted the grace of final perseverance and be delivered from Purgatory early. Blessing and distribution of the Brown Scapular will take place after the 10am Mass next Saturday morning.
