STATEMENT OF ARCHBISHOP DIARMUID MARTIN ON ORLANDO SHOOTINGS

"People all around the world are shocked with the news of the terrible loss of life at the Pulse Nightclub in Orlando. Books of condolence are open at the Pro-Cathedral in Dublin for those who wish to express their grief and outrage.

People all over the world are shocked. How do we explain that our modern society can somehow be held to ransom in successive gun attacks by individuals or small groups filled with hatred? It could happen again and it could happen anywhere. This time, the victims were members of the LGBT community; in other cases the victims were from the media or simply innocent bystanders. Fingers and blame are unfoundedly often hastily pointed at the entire honest Islamic community.

Any culture which gives notoriety to violence only encourages the deranged or the simply evil to attempt to repeat such actions. As followers of Jesus Christ, Christians should work more and more to purify ourselves from all prejudice, to be in the forefront in dialogue and reconciliation and have the resolution to courageously confront those who anywhere foster violence." -THINK ABOUT IT

Christian resistance is non-violent because the peace we want to bring is not of this world. It is brought not by enslaving our enemies, but by converting them: not by showing strength, but by sharing in the confession of common weakness; not by becoming unapproachable, but by making oneself vulnerable; not by retaliation, but by turning the other cheek, not by violence, but by love.....Jesus way is the way without weapons, violence or power.

There are only children, women and men to be loved and love does not use weapons.
