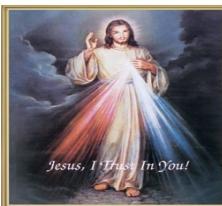

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

The Divine Mercy Devotion similar to devotion to the Sacred Heart, had its origin in the now approved revelations made to St. Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938).

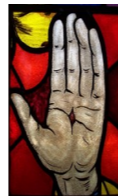
The devotion has the blessing of the Church and was especially promulgated by Pope John 11 who declared Sister Faustina a saint on 30th April 2000.

The Divine Mercy image is the image of the Risen Christ on that first Easter on the evening of the Resurrection, miraculously appearing in the upper room and bestowing on the Apostles the power of the Holy Spirit to forgive sins. His hand is raised in blessing, he shows them His wounds, and Jesus is looking for their trust.

Eucharistic Adoration

The Mass is the greatest prayer of the Church. God gave us the gift of His Son Jesus who at the Last Supper and on the Cross gave Himself up to God for our sake. Jesus rose from the dead on Easter Sunday and gave His Holy Spirit to the Church on Pentecost Sunday. Jesus gives us Himself at every Mass and remains present in the consecrated hosts of bread which are reserved in the Tabernacle or sacred place. When Jesus is present in the Church a lamp is kept lighting in the sanctuary of the church near the altar. Adoration of Jesus present in the Church offers us a special time to pray.

ADORATION of the Most Blessed Sacrament takes place in St. Canices Church on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 9am to 12noon. Wednesday evening 7pm concluding with Benediction at 8.45pm. You are invited to spend some time before the Blessed Sacrament. *Please note that this schedule may change if we have a funeral.*
