Feast of St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus.

Therese was born in France in 1873. She lived for ten years as a **Carmelite** nun. She never went on missions, or founded a religious order. A book was published after her death—a brief version of her journal called "The Story of a Soul". Within 28 years of her death the public demand was so great that she was canonized. Generations of Catholics have admired this young saint, calling her the "Little Flower", and found in her short life more inspiration for their own lives than in volumes by theologians.

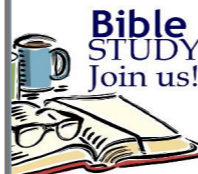
