What can we learn from the openness of Jesus?

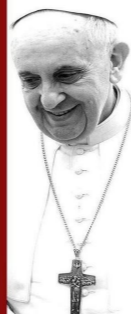

Imagine Jesus meeting that person. How would he relate to them? What would he say? How would he make them feel? And what would the response of that person be to Jesus? Spend some time watching Jesus with the person.

Then ask the Lord to help you imitate him in your dealings with that person and with others
