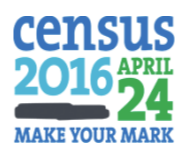
A THOUGHT On FORGIVENESS

Corrieten Boom, was a forthright Christian speaker and writer who lived in Holland during the 2nd World War and established a number of youth groups for girls. Arrested with all her family she survived internment in a Nazi concentration camp. She was released in 1945 just days after her sister died. She suffered much and had plenty of wrongs to forgive. It would have been easy for her to be consumed by resentment—yet this is what she said about forgiveness.

"Forgiveness is the key that unlocks the door of resentment and handcuffs of hate. It is a power that breaks the chains of bitterness. Only if we forgive can we take down the barriers which prevent God's love healing us. In essence, the process begins with a simple act of will, and an expectation that God will do the rest".
